Reference: **Esther 2:19-3:1**

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Mordecai is a biblical example of someone that experienced unfairness. Let's pull from this narrative some statements about unfairness:

ONE... remember unfairness \_\_\_\_\_

TWO... understand unfairness is not from \_\_\_\_\_  
God cannot be unfair because fairness is part of His nature as God.

Reference: **Proverbs 11:1**, *"Dishonest scales are an abomination to the LORD, but a just weight is His delight."*  
Reference: **Proverbs 16:11a**, *"Honest weights and scales are the LORD's..."*  
Reference: **Psalm 9:8a**, *"He (God) shall judge the world in righteousness (fairness)..."*  
Reference: **Job 8:3**, rhetorical questions *"Does God subvert judgment? Or does the Almighty pervert justice?"*

THREE... consider that the perceived unfairness might be \_\_\_\_\_

**Esther 6:1-3** (see screen)

FOUR... we should cancel our \_\_\_\_\_

FIVE... change something unfair if we can but if we can't then change our \_\_\_\_\_ about it

Changes in attitude will cause us to do three things:

- Catch our emotional response to that unfairness before it results in \_\_\_\_\_.
- Think more \_\_\_\_\_ before acting.
- Recognize the difference between what we \_\_\_\_\_ control and what we \_\_\_\_\_.
