## WHY DO BAD THINGS HAPPEN TO NOT SO GOOD PEOPLE - Part V

FOUR - Sometimes something bad happens to remind us of our **eternal reward** in heaven.

FIVE - Sometimes something bad happens so that God is **glorified** in and through that situation.

SIX - Sometimes something bad happens to act as the agent God uses to conform us to **resemble** His Son, Jesus.

The word translated as "furtherance" describes something that is \_\_\_\_\_ and moving forward in spite of obstacles, dangers and distractions. That word was actually used as an ancient Greek military term. It referred to an Army Corp of Engineers that were assigned to go ahead of the actual troops and clear away the debris from the road and then build additional roads and bridges across rivers.) Paul said that God used him and his imprisonment at Rome similar to an army corps of engineers helping to advance the gospel into enemy territories.

Question: Why did God permit Paul to be imprisoned?Answer: There are two basic reasons that made this bad thing called imprisonment a good thing.
