	There are four different categories that describe all religious systems and communities:
	Christendom is the sum total of all religious groups and organizations that theologically Christianity. Examples: Roman Catholicism, Eastern Orthodox, mainline Protestant denominations and groups
	Non-Christian cults are religious sects and groups that on the surface might resemble Christianity but actually Examples: Jehovah Witnesses, Christian Science, Unitarianism, the Way International and
	Non-Christian religions are belief systems and communities that attempt to to a divine being or beings other than the traditional Christian God. Examples: Hinduism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism, Judaism, and
	Secular religions are belief systems that have superficial religious components but are considered secular because none of them the divine or the supernatural. Examples: atheism, agnosticism, Marxism, existentialism, secular, etc.
	Christendom consists of different denominations although Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodox Catholicism do not consider themselves denominations as those churches believe that they predated denominations. Denominations are a recognized of the Christian church.

In the New England colonies there was a Puritan minister, English Reformed theologian and Baptist that founded the colony of Rhode Island. His name was Roger Williams. In 1638 Reverend Williams founded this nation's First Baptist congregation known as First Baptist church of Providence, R.I.
