JOHN'S FIRST LETTER - Introduction

"Truth and Love" Reference: I John Pastor Larry Webb

BOOK: An epistle is a message or letter and there are three epistles named after the human author John: I John, II John and III John I John consist of chapters, verses and words contingent on the particular translation that is used.
AUTHOR: I John and Hebrews are the only New Testament epistles where the author isn't identified. Although John does not name himself in this book the consensus is that John was its human author. John authored New Testament books: John's gospel, I John, II John, III John and then the prophetical book Revelation.
John's parents were Zebedee and Salome . John and his older brother James were part of the original twelve disciples. The actual name John means "God is"
TIME and LOCATION: The best guess is that this letter was written from in ancient Asia Minor (modern western Turkey) between AD.
This lesson is focused on the man God used to record His words to this book: John the apostle.
