Research from the Barna Group reveals that most people in the US believe that Jesus was an actual historical person. The percentages though do differ some according to generations: Builder generation (born before 1946)% Boomer generation (born between 1946-1964)% Buster generation (generation X) (born 1965-early 1980's)% Millennial generation (generation Y) (born mid1980's–early 2000's)%
Altogether% believe Jesus actually existed on this earth. Since most people accept that Jesus wasn't some fictional character or urban legend then the next question is, who was Jesus?
Jesus actually asked His disciples that question about Himself. Reference: Matthew 16:13-17 (see screen) Simon Peter recognized that Jesus was both the promised "the Christ" and Himself "the Son of the living God."
The first Christians used two basic arguments to convince people as to the identification of Jesus and to then encourage them to accept Jesus for themselves.
The FIRST argument was the, i.e. the literal bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

The word "Christ" is the New Testament Greek equivalent of the Old Testament Hebrew term "Messiah." That means the name Jesus Christ is the same as the

THREE is that the fulfillment of these prophecies is just
Question : Why didn't ancient Jewish people then and modern Jewish people now not accept Jesus (Yeshua) as the promised Messiah?
