## SELF-DISCIPLINE - Part I Reference: I Corinthians 9:24-27

Paul addressed the subject of self-discipline from an interesting passage in **I Corinthians chapter nine**.

The ancient Greeks hosted two popular athletic competitions: the Olympic Games that were conducted at Olympia, Greece from the eight century BC until the fourth century AD and the ancient Isthmian Games that were conducted at Corinth, Greece starting in 581 BC.

Most commentators believe that Paul was actually referencing the Isthmian games in four different New Testament passages: I Corinthians 9:24-27; I Timothy 4:7-8; II Timothy 2:5; and II Timothy 4:6-8.

Notice five statements from this passage that are related to self-discipline:

ONE...Our entire existence on earth as a Christian is compared to a \_\_\_\_\_.

Read **verse twenty-four** (see screen).

One of two things happens if we start comparing:

- If we compare ourselves to someone more successful than we are then we start feeling \_\_\_\_\_ to them.
