“Evidence for the Virgin Birth”

No other fact in the Christmas story is more important than the virgin birth. The virgin birth identified Jesus as the promised Messiah and enabled God to also become a man and ultimately the Savior.

Please notice that the virgin birth is _____ as the *Immaculate Conception*. Pope Pius IX, on December 8, 1854, decreed the doctrine of the *Immaculate Conception* to be added as an article to the Roman Catholic Church.

verse twenty-three is a direct quotation from **Isaiah 7:14**. This text from Isaiah is one of the most famous Old Testament messianic prophecies, and it predicted the virgin birth of Jesus Christ.

Reference: **Isaiah 7:14**, “*Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.*”

In Isaiah’s passage the Hebrew word translated *virgin* is “*almah*” and can sometimes (extremely rare) be translated as *young woman*. But there are two reasons this word should be translated as virgin and not young woman in this important messianic passage.

“To be precise, Jesus Christ was and is the theanthropos...the God Man. The Bible clearly teaches that Jesus was both fully God and fully man. He was one in substance (homoousios) with the Father in regard to His divine nature and one in substance with humanity in regard to His human nature. The two natures were perfectly united in the one person of Jesus Christ. To quote the Creed of Chalcedon, the Lord Jesus Christ is ‘one person in two natures, unmixed, unchanged, undivided, (and) inseparable’.”
