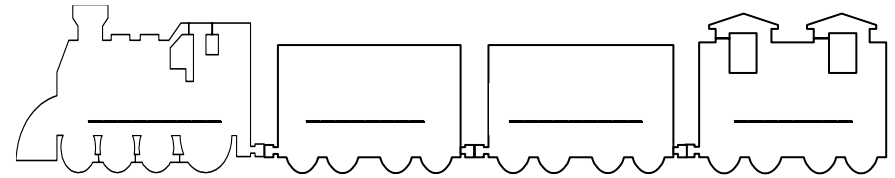
QUESTION FIVE: Are there definite and specific times when God has _____ (disciplined and corrected) me for un-confessed sin?
