The **Westminster Shorter Catechism** (1646-1647) is composed of \_\_\_\_\_ **questions** and **answers**. The most famous of those questions is the first question:

**Question:** What is the chief \_\_\_\_\_ of man?

God's glory exists in two different forms:

**Definition:** God's **intrinsic glory** is the sum total of all His \_\_\_\_\_ (characteristics) as God.

God's intrinsic glory is all that He is that makes Him who He is as God.

**Definition:** God's **indicated glory** is the glory that we \_\_\_\_\_ to Him as God.

**Definition:** Glorifying God (in an indicated sense) is all that I am bringing \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ to all that He is and does as God.
