SOME STEPS TO RESOLVING RESENTMENT/BITTERNESS

ONE... that we have resentment and bitterness.

TWO... our resentment and bitterness to God. Reference: I John 1:9 (see screen)

THREE... if the person we're resentful and bitter toward is actually guilty of an offense (remember some aren't) then forgive them in a sense and wait for them to confess their fault to us so we can then forgive them in a sense.

> Transactional forgiveness occurs when an offender confesses an offense and then from the offended.
