THE POWER OF BELONGING *The Biblical Church Member* Reference: **1 Corinthians 12:12-20** Pastor Daniel Flynn

For far too many, membership is about receiving instead of giving. So what does the Bible say about church membership?

- I. A great place to settle when looking at church membership is **1 Corinthians 12, 13,** and **14**.
 - A. Chapter 12 Paul is giving a great metaphor for the church being a body with many members.
 - B. Chapter 13 emphasizes love as the central attitude and action all members should have.
 - C. Chapter 14 goes back to the messed-up church at Corinth that has the idea of membership all wrong!

References: 1 Corinthians 12:27-28; 12

- II. We are not all alike, yet we all still work together!
 - A. EVERYONE has a role or a function.
 - B. All of us are different, but in the body, all are necessary parts of the whole body; therefore, every part has to do its work, otherwise, the whole body suffers!Reference: 1 Corinthians 12:26

III. Everything we say and do is based on a biblical foundation of love!

- A. 1 Corinthians is known as the "Love" Chapter.
 - 1. The original meaning or teaching intended for these verses was to demonstrate just how church members are to relate to one another!
 - 2. If we could just abide by the principles of the love chapter, we would have a completely healthy church!!!
 - 3. Love is patient.
 - Love is kind.
 - Love does not envy.
 - Love is not boastful.
 - Love is not conceited.
 - Love does not act improperly.
 - Love is not selfish.
 - Love is not provoked.
 - Love does not keep record of wrongs.

- B. Church membership is founded on love authentic, biblical, unconditional love!
- IV. Church membership is a functioning membership.
 - A. To remain a biblical member of the church, we give abundantly and serve without hesitation.
 - Reference: Chapter 12
 - 1. The body is a unified whole. Likewise, the church is to be unified in its mission, purposes, ministries, and activities.
 - 2. The body is made up of many parts. Each of these parts is supposed to function.
 - B. We who are the church members are all supposed to function in the church. The concept of an inactive church member is an oxymoron.
